On Saturday, April 10 our guest presenter, **Dr. Morris Nitsun** will develop the conference theme “**From Fear and Hostility to Desire and Sexuality – The Group Journey**” in two segments. In the morning he will provide didactic material and conduct a demonstration group around underlying hostilities and the creative potential of destructive forces in the group.

The afternoon program moves in a natural sequence, wherein **Dr. Nitsun** addresses the larger theme of desire as providing a container for attachment, sexuality and intimacy in group. He will again combine didactic and experiential demonstration styles.

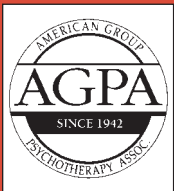
Participants will gain singular benefit from the fruits of **Dr. Nitsun’s** research and understanding of these two most profound themes in group psychotherapy as developed in his two books, “**The Anti-Group**” and “**The Group as An Object of Desire**”. Both are readily available in paperback. We expect to provide shorter readings on the www.psgpn.org website in advance of the meetings.

Dr. Morris Nitsun, PhD. is consultant clinical psychologist in Camden and Islington Mental Health NHS Trust in London. He is training group analyst at the Institute of Group Analysis and works privately at the Group Analytic Practice, London. He completed M.A. and Ph.D. degrees at Witwatersrand, with further psychotherapy training at the Tavistock Clinic in London. He has been group analyst at the Institute since 1989.

His current work spans individual and group psychotherapy, consultation and supervision. He has lectured and run workshops across the world. His two books have been described as classics.

Dr. Nitsun is also a practicing artist whose eighth exhibition of paintings took place in London in February, 2008.

On Friday, April 9 registrants will attend two 2 ½ hour sessions, one in the morning and one in the afternoon. This continues the practice instituted in our 2009 Annual Conference, offering day-long process groups in which participants may explore their leadership issues through an experiential process with colleagues and an experienced group leader of choice.
