Our conference takes place over two days. **On Friday, March 30th**, participants will form small process groups which will meet for morning and afternoon sessions. This continues our practice of providing participants a vital forum for exploring group membership and leadership issues with colleagues and an experienced facilitator of choice.

On Saturday, March 31st, we welcome Dr. Rutan to our conference. He will lead participants through experiential, conversational, and didactic components developing our conference theme.

In his group work and teaching Dr. Rutan reaches beyond earlier trainings in conflict theory, which focused on external anger and aggression, to emphasize the conflict around intimacy, attachment, connection and closeness. At this year's annual conference, Dr. Rutan will provide leadership in how Object Relations and Attachment theories help us to see that "group members are, at all times, trying their best to be in relationships, not out of them."

From this premise, Dr. Rutan will demonstrate the fascinating theoretical and technical consequences that follow.

The workshop will also consider the therapist's need to belong and how that might facilitate or interfere with therapeutic uses of the group.

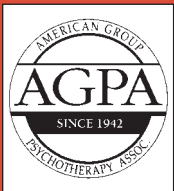
Dr. Rutan is well known for innovative, engaging, experiential and engaging presentations. He may well include video segments from TV or movies to elaborate his points.

Scott Rutan, PhD is a Distinguished Fellow and Past President of AGPA. He was on the faculty of Harvard Medical School for over 20 years, where he founded the Massachusetts General Hospital Center for Group Psychotherapy. In 1970 he was one of the Founders of the Boston Institute for Psychotherapy, where he now teaches group psychotherapy. He has authored many articles and books, including being the senior author of Psychodynamic Group Psychotherapy, which many consider the finest text in our field. Dr. Rutan has lectured extensively both here and abroad.
